Youth Radio is coming of age

Eastbourne Youth Radio returns to the airwaves this month on 87.7FM and www.eyr.org.uk in association with Sussex Downs College

Eastbourne Youth Radio (EYR) has reached adulthood, celebrating its 16th year in 2016. The popular radio station, organised by Eastbourne Education Business Partnership (EEBP) returns to the airwaves on 87.7FM and online at www.eyr.org.uk from Wednesday 16th-Friday 18th November, broadcast from Sussex Downs College, Eastbourne.

Students from 25 Eastbourne schools and other organisations each present an hour-long radio show across the three days. The students, who range in age five to 19, will present programmes on a range of topics and in a variety of formats. Expect music, poetry, plays, interviews and debates.

This year's EYR coincides with Anti-Bullying Week 2016, the theme of which is 'Power for Good'. Some of the schools will be exploring this topic



through their shows, using the power of the airwaves to demonstrate 'Power for Good'.

For the third year running, EYR is broadcast in partnership with the Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Katy Bourne. The EEBP received a grant from the PCC's Safer in Sussex Community Fund to

support and broadcast EYR. Tim Sorensen, EYR manager, has been running the EYR project from the start. He says about Katy Bourne's involvement: "The Sussex PCC will be helping to address the issue of bullying and garner more attention around young people's mental health needs. Katy Bourne is an active

campaigner and has often praised EYR for its insightful projects 'benefitting the entire community and businesses'."

EYR gives youngsters control over the airwaves in a producer and presenter capacity. "The employability skills you learn from producing original radio shows are transferable to any

workplace environment," Tim continues. "If you have a passion for producing or presenting then this is definitely the project for you. For students who don't want to speak on air, the teamwork skills and planning of the projects are all a fantastic experience. There really is something in it for everyone."

EYR is made possible by local businesses who sponsor the high quality of sponsors involved with the programming give the students the inspiration to produce a quality and informative show. Among the sponsors this year are Stone Cross Nurseries, Caffyns, Eastbourne Arndale Shopping Centre, East Sussex Fire & Rescue Service and University of Brighton.

ESFRS Station Commander, Mark Webb, said, "East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service is proud to be sponsoring Eastbourne Youth Radio again this year.

"This year we have two key messages to share through EYR which are road safety

and water safety. It is widely acknowledged that younger drivers are at greater risk of death or injury on the roads.

"Both of these issues are particularly relevant for the students of Sussex Downs College [ESFRS sponsor their show] as many of them are learning to drive and approaching the legal age to consume alcohol."

Highlights across the three days include the flagship show, 'Answer Back'. The popular panel show features local politicians and business professionals taking questions from students on subjects both local and national. Expect Brexit to feature!

Back by popular demand is the hour-long 'Meet the Media' panel where students get to quiz industry experts on what it takes to build a career in the Media.

As EYR celebrates its move into adulthood, the standard has been set high. "Every year the quality of the shows increase," says Tim, "and this year is no exception. This is definitely the year to tune in."

EYR whatever the weather

EYR will again be providing hourly forecast updates so listeners can prepare for the day in advance. This is possible thanks to local sponsors, members of The Best of Eastbourne website: Alandale Plant Ltd, Cooden Tax Consulting and Artemi Photography.

Knowing the weather is an essential part of each day, students will be using specialised weather equipment that will be stationed at Sussex Downs College to provide you will regular updates. Students participating in EYR will receive demonstrations on how to correctly read the weather equipment," says EYR Manager Tim Sorensen. "These updates will consist



of Eastbourne and the surrounding areas, ensuring listeners don't get caught out this month. The weather is essential to any radio station and EYR will be no different. This is a fantastic experience for the students."

Students take on BBC presenter's news bootcamp

Eastbourne Youth Radio wouldn't be complete without its supporting events and 2016 is no exception with the return of the Newsroom Bootcamp. Hosted by John Young (BBC South East Today and John Young Media), the Newsroom Bootcamp took place at the Congress Suite, Eastbourne, on Wednesday 19th October. The interactive morning saw 45 students from local schools gain expertise and insight into a working newsroom.

Students enhanced their employability skills by exploring key industry roles including researchers, producers, newsreaders and camera crew. Whilst the focus was on jobs in the newsroom environment, the skills gained included teamwork, communication, written work, time management and presentation, making it relatable to any workplace.

As part of the bootcamp, students were asked: 'what makes the news?' whether it be something new, different, serious, significant, weird, or extraordinary. Using these as starting points alongside typical news values, students were taught to prepare

headlines which they later presented. Alongside this, students were asked to react efficiently and effectively to breaking news. They learnt to adapt their broadcast to the new developments they were given by John, boosting students' organisational skills.

Working to tight deadlines throughout this task ensured the students concentrated and were engaged constantly.

The final segment of the day provided students with an entirely new skill by the introduction of an autocue demonstration. This proceeded with all the pupils having a practice reading from the professional autocue equipment. Building confidence in the students' presenting abilities was paramount during this task. The day concluded with students combining their newly acquired techniques to read, film and watch back their own news broadcast.

Speaking about the event John said: "As always at this event, I was struck by just how sharp and engaged many of the children were. I wasn't there to turn them all into journalists -- but I was there

to make them think about the world around them, to think quickly, write powerfully and step out of their comfort zones in front of my video camera. Most of them embraced that; it's always a pleasure to watch it unfolding."

In total six local schools (St John's Meads, Tollgate, Stafford, Stone Cross, Pevensey & Westham and Polegate) all participated in the Newsroom Bootcamp Challenge. Each school attended a 90-minute session that was repeated twice during the day.

John currently appears two days a week on BBC South East Today reporting and presenting the local news. The rest of the week John delivers his John Young Media Newsroom Bootcamp workshops. John not only offers these workshops to local schools but local businesses can now also reap the benefits of these activities. The workshops provide great team building and confidence boosting activities for staff, plus they're office-based, saving managers the hassle of booking an activity centre. Police chief supports key project

Recognising the great impact the event has on young people and the community, Sussex Police & Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne has come on board as the lead partner for 2016 for the third year in a row.

Through supportive funding from her Safer in Sussex Community Fund (SiSCF) Katy Bourne supports the EYR Launch Mix programme on Wednesday 16 November from 10am. Mrs Bourne said: "Eastbourne Youth Radio (EYR) is a well-established and respected local project which I'm very pleased to support through my Community Safety Fund. Every year the radio provides a unique opportunity for young people to engage with their communi-

ties and speak out on local issues. This year I had the pleasure of being interviewed by broadcasting students Aiden and Alan from Sussex Downs College. The interview was about bullying and the distressing consequences it can have on a young person's self-esteem and mental health. I was joined in the interview by one of my Youth Commission Members, Josh Funnell, who had researched cyber-bullying and online harassment with his peers as part of his volunteering work with the Youth Commission.

Josh was able to share some of his research and findings on why this is a growing problem and why many young people don't feel that it is being taken seriously enough. We all agreed that it is vital that victims report bullying and are encouraged to talk about it openly as opposed to suffering in silence. During the interview we also discussed the hate crime reporting app that I funded last year; the police Stop and Search video that the Youth Commission were consulted on; and the National Prevent Programme designed to stop radicalization amongst young people. I wish the EYR every success with this year's programme."


